### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- 1. Race for Glory, 2024: Tom Schmidt reported the Race raised around \$12,000-13,000 for 4 charities with about 90 runners and walkers participating.
- 2. 2024 Clambake on October 5, 2024: Tom Schmidt reported that Gas Grills and Volunteers are still needed throughout the day at Camp Paradise. Please review the outline below created by Tom Schmidt and help where you can.

  - i. We will pick up stainless steel cookers on Saturday morning. They open at 9:30 AM.
  - ii. Inside the cookers, we will have to set up the chicken, sweet potatoes, and clams.
  - iii. The corn is packed separately and not shucked.
  - iv. Coleslaw, paper goods, rolls, and butter are packaged separately.
  - v. The Process:
    - 1. Water is placed at the bottom of the steamers.
    - 2. The cooker's burners are lit at 2:00 PM. The chicken, sweet potatoes, and clams are inside the steamers at the lighting.
    - 3. The cookers produce steam for 35 to 45 minutes (2:45 PM). Chicken, sweet potatoes, and clams cook for another 45 minutes (3:30 PM).
    - 4. Chicken is pulled from the cookers and finished off on the grill. The chicken are halves both white and dark meat.
    - 5. The shucked corn replaces the chicken in the cooker.
    - 6. Corn, Potatoes, and clams continue to cook for another 30-45 minutes (4:15 PM).
    - 7. We could round up propane grills and get them in place by Friday (3 propane tanks are available for use).
- 3. Golf Shirt Order has arrived. If you have not contacted Dan Cathcart about your order and payment, please do so ASAP.
- 4. At the last meeting we talked about the Children's Center of Medina County and a donation of \$500 to their Child Advocacy Operational Fund (check was cut by Mark Shee).
- 5. Our Knights of Columbus Bowling team is still looking for Bowlers Please Contact Tom Maren.

6. We are still waiting for the Appraiser, who is experiencing serious Health Issues - per Andy Swancer.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. We had an Eagle Scout Project presentation by Grant Tomecko (assisted by Deacon Mark Tomecko his Dad) at the last meeting. His project is a 2 Phased landscaping effort at Zelie's Home (a Community where Women Thrive as they embrace Motherhood). Motion raised by Matt Lower to give Grant \$1,000 from the Boy Scout Fund. Seconded by Andy Swancer. Motion approved. Mark Shee wrote a check for \$1,000 to Grant Tomecko.
- 2. Our Lady Help of Christians has a new Seminarian Cameron Galla, who has started at Borromeo Seminary and John Carroll University. I (WGK) have spoken to Father Ed Suszynski (Pastor of OLHC) Cameron and we traded contact information. In our Officer's Meeting we talked about an annual amount of ~ \$1,000 to Cameron until his Ordination in about 8 years. WGK also mentioned this to our District Deputy Tom Donovan who stated "Congratulation Such a Blessing The Knights are in full support of the Seminary both individually and as a group. Through the RSVP program the council can give a direct check to Cameron, Any amount over \$500 earns the council a \$100 rebate for the council ie Council gifts check of \$500 receives \$100 check so net gift to council is only \$400. I would also invite Cameron to your council social events and any other events perhaps host him for a dinner or lunch over the. School breaks If you have any questions don't hesitate to call me ". A discussion of Cameron Galla took place after this information was presented. A decision was made to table any discussion concerning a contribution. Also noted by the membership that Students becoming Knights, as well as Priests, contribute \$0 in dues annually. We will make an attempt to contact Cameron and invite him to our Clambake (for free - a \$40 value) or invite him to one of our Meetings.

### **LECTURER'S REFLECTION - BRIAN LOMBARDI:**

Brothers, the month of September is dedicated to the Holy Cross, celebrated by the Church on September 14th. Bishop Barron calls out that it took nearly 1000 years for humanity to even accept that Jesus, the Son of God Himself, could have died in such a horrible manner. Back at that time, everyone associated the cross with torture for criminals and as an object of terror. They couldn't even think about the cross without cringing in fear. Back then, nobody wore crosses around their necks or gazes at a crucifix in hope. Fast forward to today, when it is commonplace and even inspirational look out and see crosses in the skylines on churches, and compliment people on the beauty of their new neckless with a cross on it. In fact, Sept 14th is actually titled the "Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross". Feast? Like a celebration? What changed? It was the gradual acceptance over time that death on a cross was the price of our salvation. And yet, we now replace the horrible cross with our daily problems, which we now label pretty much anything that doesn't go our way as our "crosses".

Gentlemen-Crosses are bigger than that. For instance, we just learned last evening that Holly Honsey, a young mother in our parish with 4 young children passed away. (WGK note: please remember Stacy Gilbert, too). When we hear that kind of news, we cringe, just like the people did at the crucifixion, and rightly so. So let's keep in mind to not elevate our problems to become crosses and rather be aware and act justly when real crosses arise. Instead, we, as Knights, must be called into action to step up when we hear of people in need.

So this month's 3 level challenge: .1 Offer a rosary for the repose of the soul of Holly and for God's protection of their family going forward. .2 Find a way to

assist in the needs of the Honsey family (and Gilbert family) in the coming days, weeks, and months of adjustment and healing to lighten their load. .3 Take some time privately in the coming month, to sit down and ask God to reveal to you some answers to the bigger theological questions like "God, why do these kinds of bad things happen?" We avoid these questions, but at some point we'll all be faced with them. (As a person who has been near death twice, I'd be happy to share my insights into the meaning of life and death.)
